# European elections on **26 May** 2019 in Germany

## How it works:

**You are German or an EU citizen from another country and are living in Germany.**

### YOU:

- are at least 18 years old
- have been living for more than 3 months in Germany or in another EU Member State
- are registered to vote in your home municipality. If you are German with your primary residence in Germany, you are usually already registered. The first time you vote as an EU citizen from another country, you must apply for the electoral documents from the municipality where you live in Germany.

If you meet these conditions, you will receive the voter notification with all necessary information by mail.

## Not at home? No time?

### You can also vote by postal vote at the European elections!

#### REMEMBER:

**You have to re-apply for a postal ballot for each election.**

Just fill in the back of the voter notification and send it back.

In many municipalities, you can also request postal ballot documents online.

You will then receive the postal ballot documents by mail.

In the European elections, you have **one vote for one party** standing in Germany.

There are **96 Members of the European Parliament** from **Germany**. Overall, after the European elections there will be **705 Members of the European Parliament**.
